Supporting documentation for native title assessments

It is essential you attach to your native title assessment form (**Annexure 7.1**) all relevant documentation used in making your native title assessment. Your native title assessment must be a stand-alone document. There should be no need to consult other documents to find information you used in your assessment.

Documentation to be attached to your native title assessment, where relevant, includes -

- SmartMaps, survey plans and maps
- ATS reports
- QNTIME reports and maps
- the tenure history report
- a copy of the title, e.g. did you rely upon the grant of a freehold estate?
- a copy of the lease instrument, e.g. did you rely upon a grazing homestead perpetual lease?
- a copy of gazettal notices, e.g. for reserves, roads
- a copy of letters, submissions, memorandums
- a site inspection report, e.g. did you rely upon a public work?;
- photos, e.g. for public works
- sketch plans showing location of works and section 251D area or boundaries of tenures
- aerial photographs
- a copy of any policy advice from Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Land Services about your proposed dealing.
