**57**% Emptying their car waste onto a car park or roadside (QLD average 58%)

LEAST LIKELY TO REPORT

**21**% Leaving rubbish behind on a public picnic table (QLD average 23%)

14% Leaving rubbish behind at a stadium or concert (QLD average 16%)

**74** % Leaving goods in bushland or national park (QLD average 56%)

LEAST LIKELY TO REPORT

22% Leaving goods outside a charity shop or donation bins (QLD average 22%)

35% Leaving green waste in bushland or national park (QLD average 36%)
