

Julian's Key Health Passport Social Script

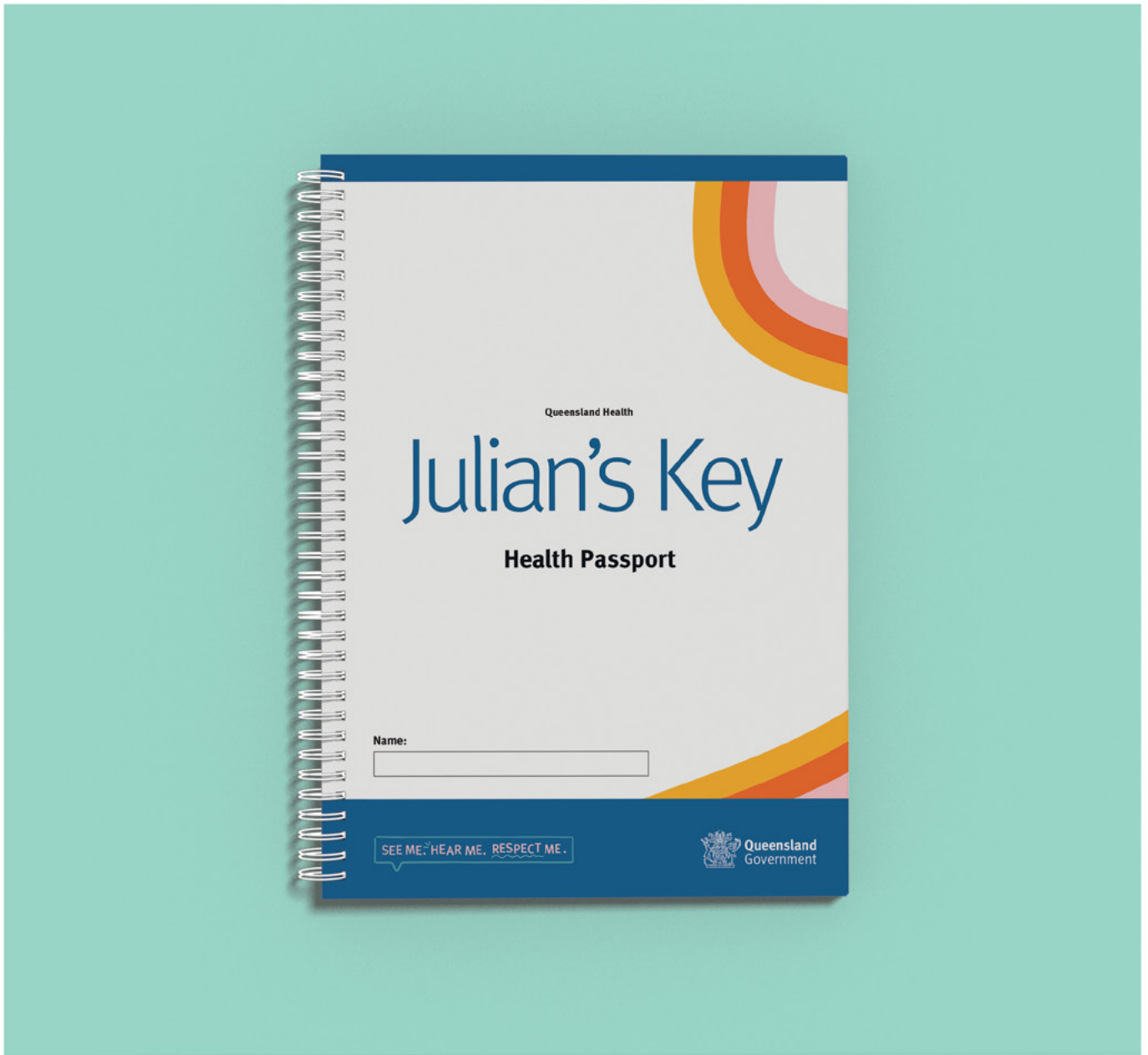
Use this social script with your carer or family member to understand how you can use Julian's Key Health Passport when communicating with healthcare staff.

I can also call it Health Passport.



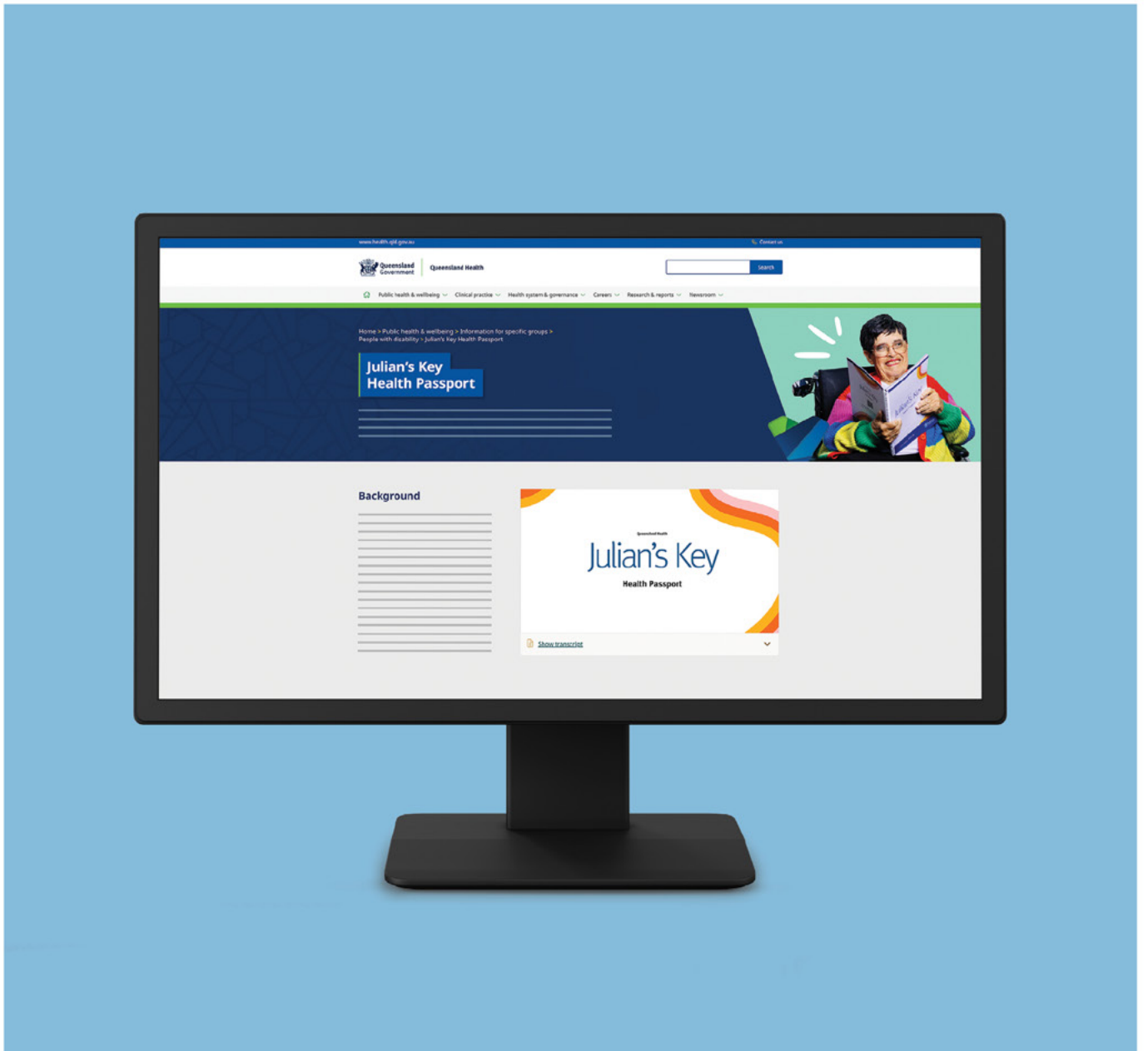
The Health Passport is a tool that helps me communicate, so that I can get the best care.

It can help the nurse, doctor or hospital staff know about my health needs.

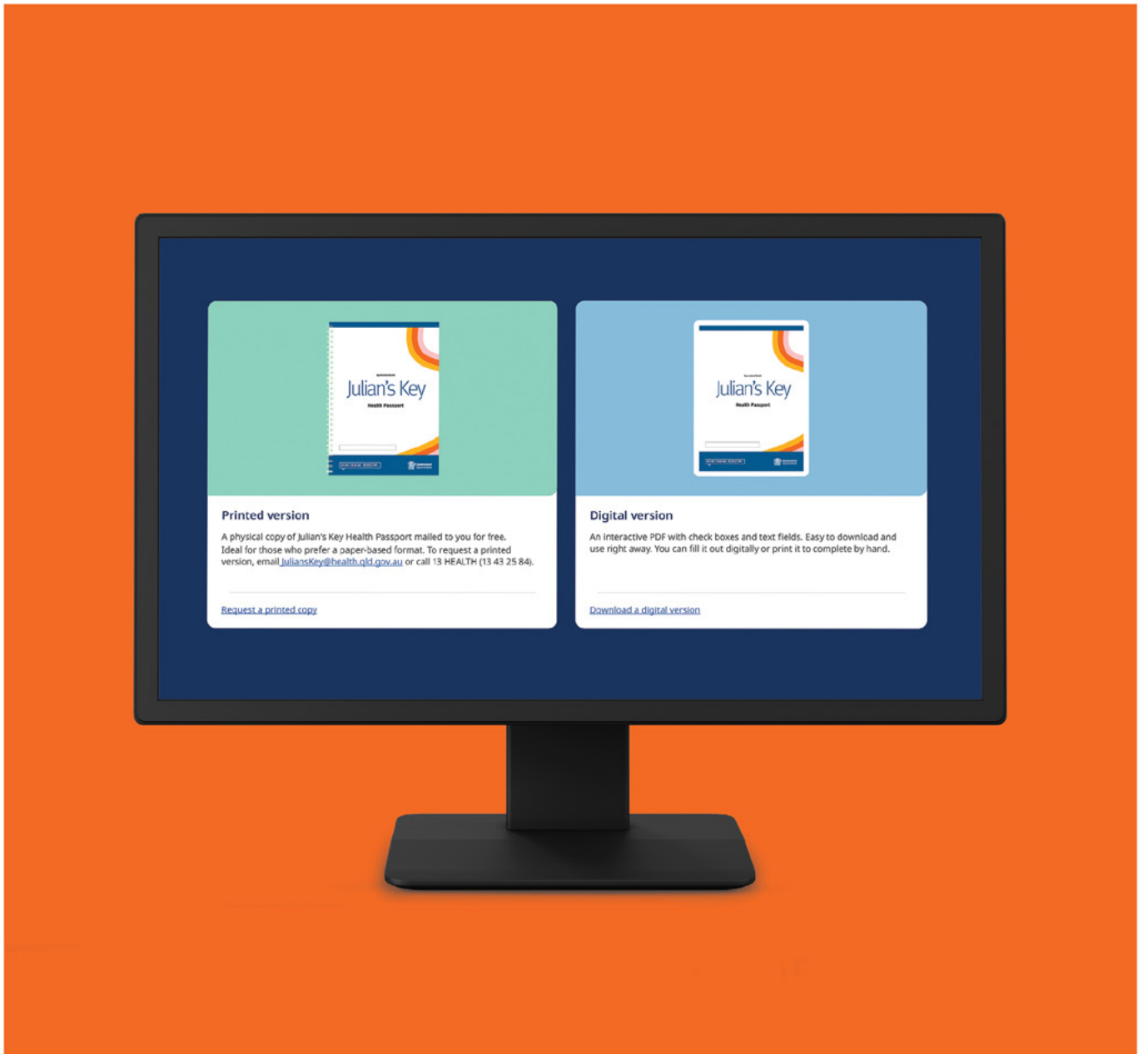


There are two ways to get a Health Passport.

If I have a computer, I search Julian's Key Health Passport on the internet.



I open the website. I scroll down and look up the available versions.



I can ask for a copy or I can download a digital version of the Health Passport.



If I don't have a computer, I or my carer can send an email to JuliansKey@health.qld.gov.au.

on **13 43 25 84** and ask them for a copy.

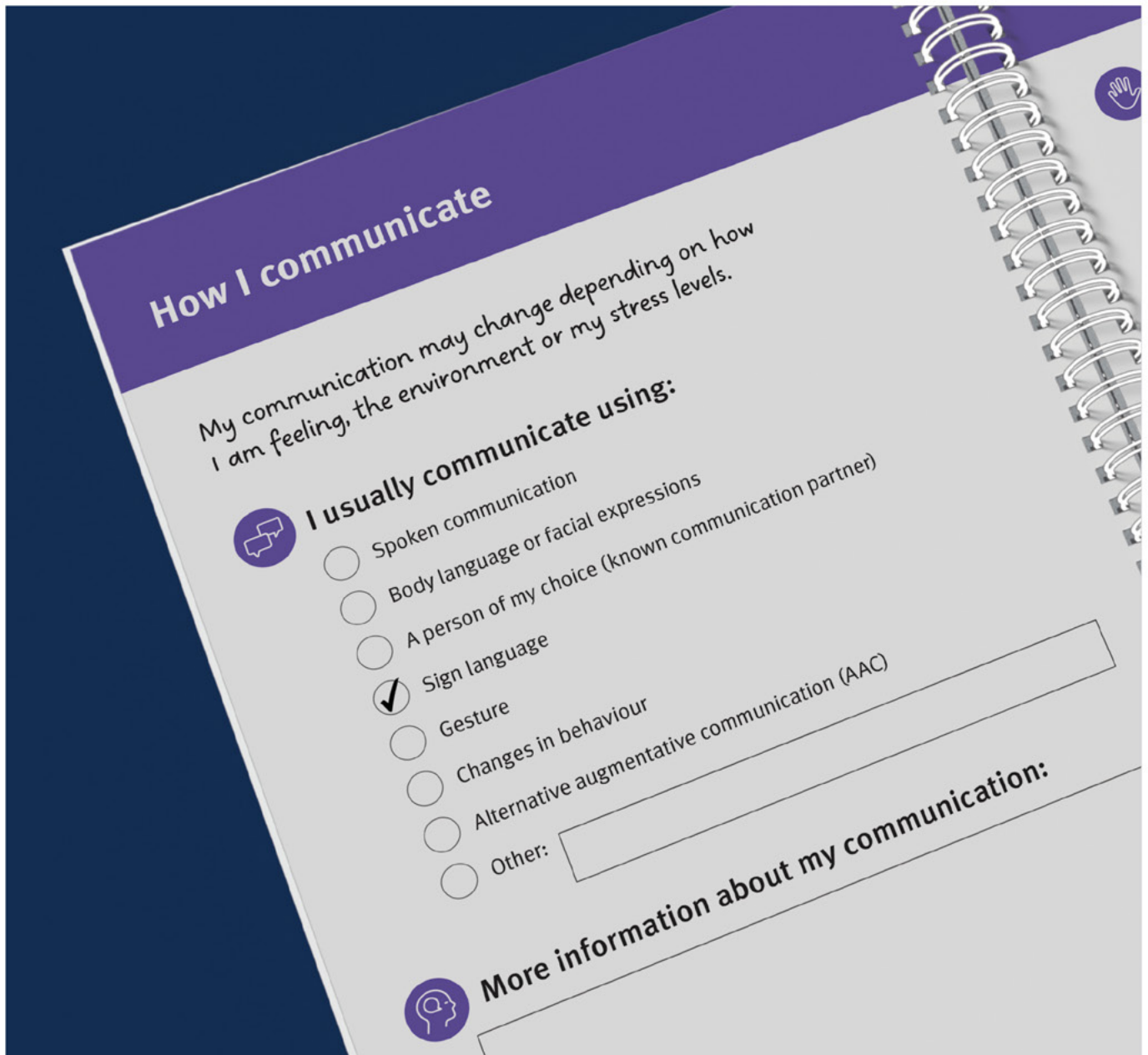


The Health Passport has a lot of parts.
It asks important things about me.

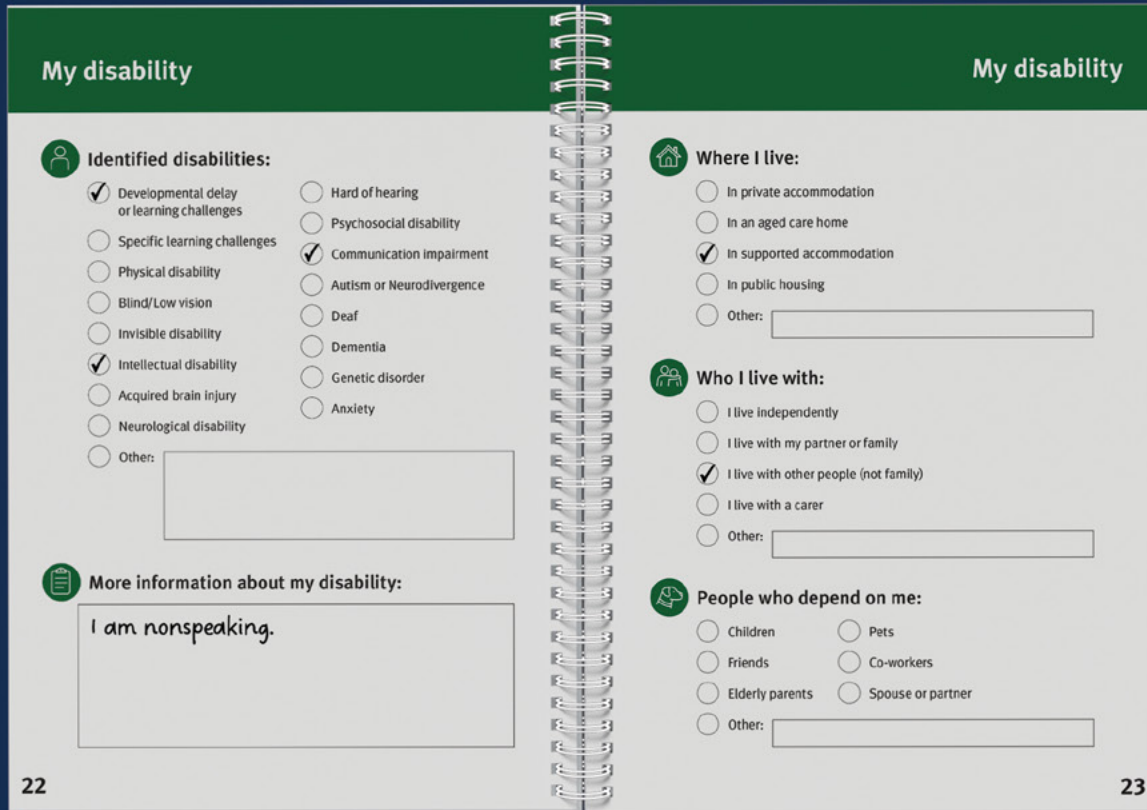
For example, how I communicate, what disability
I have and what my care needs are.



There are boxes where I write something about me.



There are boxes I can tick.



There are many pages. I do not have to answer all the questions. I can stop and rest if I get tired.

It's ok to only write down the things I want the nurse or doctor to know about me.



I can also ask my family or carer to help me write down what I want to share about myself.

If I am not sure, I or my carer can call **13 HEALTH** on **13 43 25 84** and ask them for help.



It is important to keep my Health Passport up to date.
I need to write down any changes to my communication or care needs.



I or my carer can print my digital Health Passport when I finish filling it out.



I keep it in a safe place where I or my carer can easily find it if I have to go to a hospital or community health clinic.

I will let my carer know that this is important.



I bring my Health Passport with me when I go to a hospital or community health clinic.



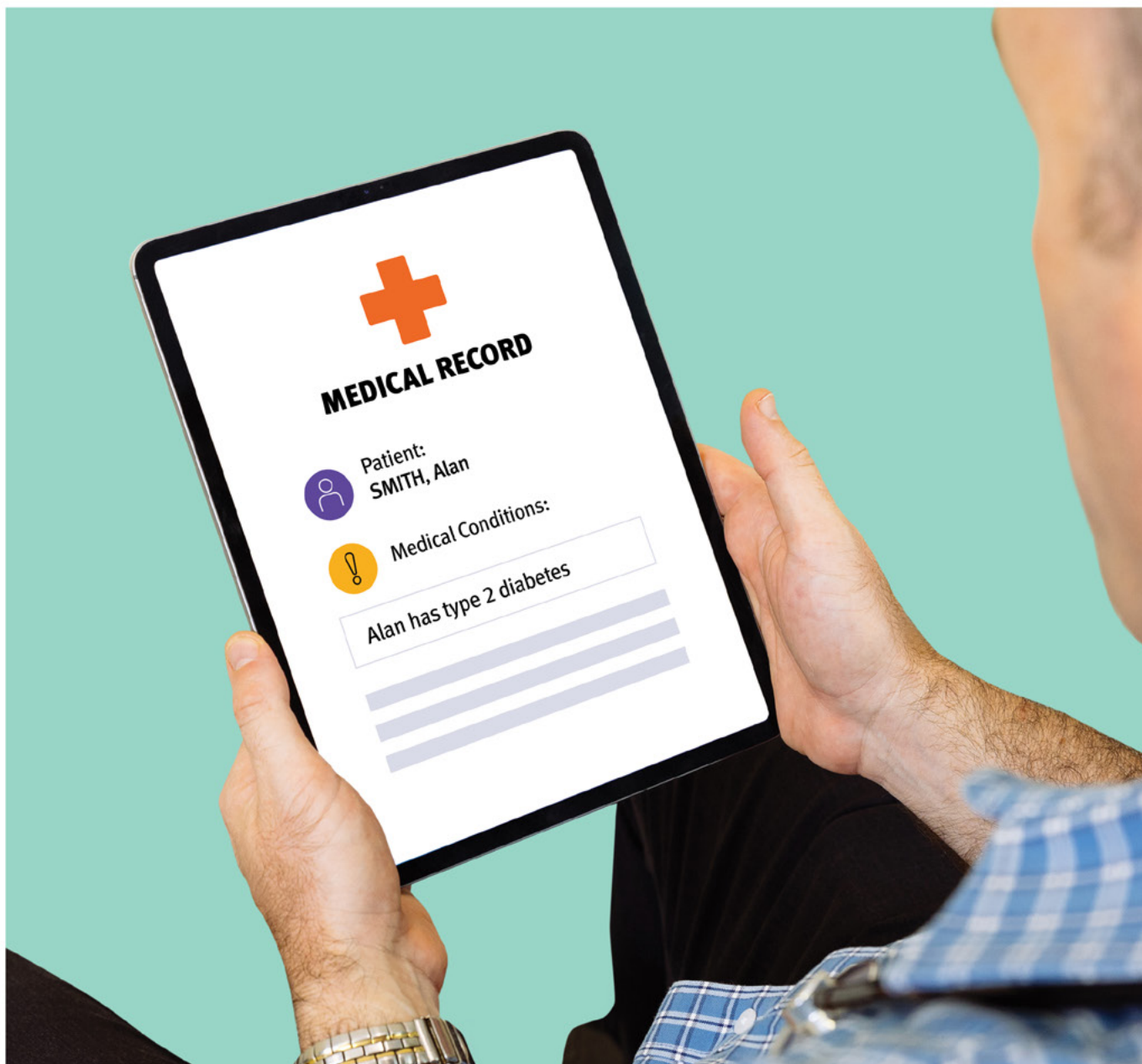
I show my Health Passport to the nurse, doctor or hospital staff before they treat me.



If I am too sick to speak, my carer can show my Health Passport to the nurse, doctor or hospital staff before they treat me.



The nurse, doctor or hospital staff will read my Health Passport.



They will ask me if they can copy my information.



I or my carer need to ask for my Health Passport back when they finish reading it.

I cannot leave it with the hospital or community health clinic. I or my carer need to keep it.
