LEAST LIKELY TO REPORT

22% Leaving rubbish behind on a public picnic table (QLD average 23%)

16% Leaving rubbish behind at a stadium or concert (QLD average 16%)

LEAST LIKELY TO REPORT

25% Leaving goods outside a charity shop or donation bins (QLD average 22%)

34% Leaving green waste in bushland or national park (QLD average 36%)
