Overview

Queensland plays a significant role in preserving Australia's First Nations languages, holding the nation's second largest Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander population.

More than 100 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander languages and dialects were once spoken in Queensland. Today, around 50 of these languages are still spoken with less than 20 used as a first language, predominantly in the north of the state and in the Torres Strait Islands.

The Indigenous Languages Grants support Queensland-based activities that contribute to the preservation and revival of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander languages.

Grants of up to \$15,000 (exclusive of GST) per activity will be available for eligible organisations.

Applications close – 8am (AEST) Friday 27 June 2025.

- The Indigenous Languages Grants Program supports projects and cultural activities that preserve, maintain and promote Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander languages.
- Grants of up to \$15,000 (exclusive of GST) per activity are available for Queensland-based activities that support the preservation of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander languages.
- Indigenous Languages Grants are provided to activities that preserve Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander languages in recognition of the role language plays in strengthening culture and community.
- A range of cultural initiatives incorporating Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander languages may be eligible for an Indigenous Languages Grant, including art, drama, music and film projects, Yarning Circles, audio recordings, workshops, signage, books, posters and brochures.
- The total funding available in 2024-25 is \$285,000.
- The Indigenous Languages Grants round closes at 8am Friday 27 June 2025.

Queensland-based projects and cultural activities that preserve, maintain and promote Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander languages are invited to apply for an Indigenous Languages Grant.

Grants of up to \$15,000 are available for activities that support the preservation of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander languages.

In Queensland, more than 100 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander languages and dialects were once spoken. Today around 50 of these remain, with less than 20 used as first languages.

The Queensland Government Indigenous Languages Grants program aims to preserve First Nations languages in recognition of the role language plays in strengthening culture and community.
