

Free COVID-19 RAT Kits

For asylum seekers without concession cards- August 2022

This factsheet explains how people seeking asylum and or between visas can now access free Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) kits.

Queensland Health is providing free RAT kits to people who have Australian Government concession cards. Many asylum seekers might not be eligible for these. For this reason, Queensland Health has expanded its eligibility for accessing RAT kits.

If you do not hold any Australian Government concession cards, you can still access RAT kits for free. You can collect up to 5 individual RAT kits (or 1 box of 5 tests) per month and collect all 5 RAT kits in a single visit.

Where can I get a free RAT kit?

Queensland Health is now distributing RAT kits at many locations in the community. Find your nearest distribution point [here](#), or scan the QR code below.

What do I need to show the staff at the distribution point?

If you have an Australian Government concession card (such as a health care card or pension card), you can provide this.

If you do not hold any of these cards:

1. Tell staff that you are an asylum seeker.
2. Show them your passport or other available identification (such as travel document; Immicard; Visa evidence card; Drivers' license; IHMS card or student card).
3. You can show this fact sheet to staff if they are unaware of your eligibility.

It does not matter which visa you are currently on, so long as you provide any of your information requested above. You will need to provide this information every time you visit a distribution point. Wear a face mask if you have any COVID-19 symptoms
