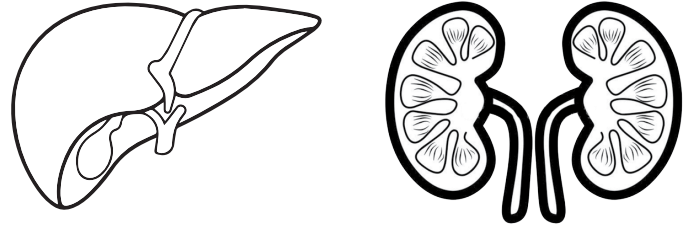


Transplant Unit



The Transplant Unit Ward 4BT (W4BT), plays a key role in the patient's post-transplant life.

- The 14 bed Transplant Ward 4BT, known also as “The Transplant Unit” is on the 4th floor of the main building. Near blue lifts.
- After hours entry to W4BT is through Emergency Department, located on the 1st floor via the Cornwall Street entrance.
- Preparation for transplant surgery usually occurs on W4BT from where the patient is taken to the operating theatre.
- Full information is provided about the discharge process to patients and their families during their time on the transplant ward.
- In the days after the transplant, patients are supported by transplant ward staff to learn how to manage their medications, their exercise and their general activities of daily living (ADL's).
- Some patients experience complications which can extend their stay by several days or weeks.
- Patients attend daily 4A outpatient clinic for the first few weeks after the transplant. The 4A outpatient clinic area is on level 4 near the blue lifts. The transplant ward and clinic remains the main contact point if there are any concerns at all.
- The Queensland Liver Transplant Service and Queensland Kidney Transplant Service, continues caring for patients at all stages of post-transplantation. The staff are highly trained, caring and have an excellent knowledge of transplantation. They are able to help and support patients at any time.
